

Victorian Cycles

Key Stage 1 and 2 (years 1 - 4)

75 minute facilitated session

Our Victorian Cycles workshop explores real cycles, by combining History with STEM subjects. Students will learn how cycles came to be made in Coventry, and then find out how they changed into cycles that we would recognise today. Through a carousel of 4 practical activities, supported by school and museum staff, students will investigate materials, create cycle frame models, and examine cycles up close. Students will then use their newly found understanding to explain why cycles changed in appearance so quickly in the Victorian Era.

Teacher Notes

The session uses scooters, please let us know in advance if you have any students who may not be
physically able to use them, as we would like to discuss how we might be able to accommodate the
pupil's needs.
